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NFFCC PLAYER OF THE WEEK



Liam Szarka, Air Force
Junior | QB | 5-11 | 190
Aurora, Colo. / Grandview HS

Junior quarterback Liam Szarka rushed for a career-high 171 yards on a career-high 33 carries and scored two touchdowns in a double overtime win at Nevada. His 33 carries and 171 yards are the most by a Falcon this season and most by an Air Force quarterback since Isaiah Sanders had 44 carries for 196 yards vs. Utah State in 2017. Szarka also hit 5-of-12 passes for 92 yards and a touchdown. His touchdown pass came in the fourth quarter on a fourth-and-goal and gave Air Force a two-score lead. Eleven of his carries went for first downs or touchdowns, including four on fourth down. Szarka carried the ball five times on Air Force's six plays in the first overtime, and added three carries on the five plays in the second overtime.

2026 NFFCC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

SEPTEMBER 1, 2026

Carter Daniels, CSU Pueblo

SO | LB | 5-10 | 200 | Centennial, Colo. | Mountain Vista HS

In the Pack's 44-25 season opening win over Central Missouri this past Thursday, Daniels had a memorable game in his first career start as he recorded a total of 16 tackles, including five solo stops and added 1.5 sacks, 1.5 tackles for a loss, and returned an interception 38 yards for a touchdown to give the Pack a 44-18 lead with 6:10 left in the game. The 16 tackles were the most by a Pack player in a game since Jon Nuschy had 17 tackles against Grand Valley State during the 2024 season. The 16 tackles are also tied for the third-most by a Division II player this season. His 38-yard interception return for a score in the fourth quarter was his first career interception and the Pack's 56th interception return for a touchdown since the program rebooted in 2008 and the 20th interception return for a score since the beginning of the 2019 season.

Hauss Hejny, Colorado State

2nd Year | QB | Aledo, Texas | Aledo HS | TCU | Oklahoma State

Hauss Hejny completed 23-of-33 passes for 214 yards with five touchdowns in a 35-13 win over Wyoming. He added 39 yards rushing and additionally made an amazing catch for 28 yards on a flea-flicker. His five passing touchdowns matched a program record for most in a season-opening game for a Rams signal caller. Hejny completed a pass to 10 different receivers, and had a streak of 10 straight completions during the game. His lone reception helped set up the opening-drive touchdown to set the tone for the Rams offense. Hejny's longest pass of the night came on a 57-yard strike to RJ Vick for one of their three touchdown connections on the night.

Navi Bruzon, Colorado State Pueblo

Sophomore | QB | 5-10 | 195 | Peoria, Ariz. | Liberty HS Arizona State | Highland CC

Pack sophomore quarterback Navi Bruzon continued his impressive start to the 2026 season in the No. 5 Pack's 45-17 home win over Mines in both teams' RMAC openers this past Saturday. In the win over the Orediggers, Bruzon completed 22-of-27 passes (81.5 completion percentage) for a career-high 421 yards and four touchdowns and added nine yards rushing for a season-high 430 yards of total offense. He connected on touchdown passes of 75, 66, 24, and 38 yards in the win over Mines as the Pack finished Saturday's game with a season-high 588 yards of total offense. The 421 passing yards are the fourth-most in school history and the most since Roman Fuller threw for 442 yards last season at home against Chadron State and the third-most so far this season in a game by a Division II quarterback.

Quarterback Joseph Capra had one of the most efficient outings of his career to lead Mines to a 34-3 win over Fort Lewis. In less than three quarters of work, Capra went 16-of-22 for 267 yards and three touchdowns, and also rushed for 55 net yards. He threw touchdowns of 27, 9, and 65 yards in compiling a career-high QBR of 219.67.
